







What was your favorite part of the program?

Skip did an amazing job selecting speakers with incredible backgrounds that are relevant to our positions and in line with the goal of building regional leaders.








Meeting and learning about our classmates. It was interesting to hear about their professional challenges and aspirations, along with little insights into their personal lives to add to the complexity of who they are.

I learned that becoming and growing as a leader is something I cannot do on my own. I am surrounded by great leaders and I need to use them as a resource.






You NEVER stop learning and developing as a leader.
